A 20th Century look back - in the decades before and after our class graduated...

When I stopped in to the Advancement Office at school after some alumni masses, I took a look at yearbooks for a glimpse into the classes of 1930, 1950, 1960, 1980 and 1990. Some observations...

There were 45 members of the **1930** senior class including 22 boys and 23 girls at the high school's fourth annual graduation at the Fourth and Webster Streets' location. The yearbook was called *The Brown and Gold*. One of the graduates was Ruth Rose Showers who, I think, later became Mr. Culver's mother. There was also a Clement Michael Repsher, James Philip Talbot, and Mary Bernadette Willey who may be ancestors to Lee (Repsher), Linda (Talbot) and Sue (Willey)?

There is/was no printed yearbook for the Class of **1940**, so I was unable to find some factoids. **Does anyone have (or can get) information about this or any class from 1931 through 1949?** I'm pretty sure some of your ancestors have roamed the halls of Beca at the Fourth and Webster location.

There were 53 members of the **1950** senior class at the Fourth and Webster Streets' location including 14 (26%) boys and 39 (74%) girls. Father Joseph V. Sangmeister was the principal. The first printed yearbook in 2 decades was printed. The new nickname "**Golden Hawks**" was introduced. The boys' basketball team won the Eastern PA State Championship.

There were 146 members of the senior class of **1960**, including 50 (34%) boys and 96 (66%) girls. It was the largest class of seniors at the Fourth and Webster Streets' location. Fr. Sangmeister was the principal. Bob Bukvics was a member of the senior class, scored 1,467 points, and was an integral member of the 1960 State Championship basketball team. Sr. Irma Loreto taught art and math.

There were 263 members of our senior class in **1970**, including 133 Boys (51%) and 130 girls (49%). It was the first class to have more boys than girls in the school's history...at least in since 1950. Brother Frederick McAuley, C.S.C., was the principal. Bob Bukvics taught world cultures and coached boys' basketball. Sr. Irma Loreto taught math and was the senior class moderator. Dick Culver taught math.

In **1980** there were 177 graduates including a ~50/50 split of boys (89) and girls (88). Dick Culver was the principal. Bob Bukvics was social studies chairperson, taught math and coached boys' basketball. Sr. Irma Loreto was a math tutor, nurse's aide and coordinator of graduation.

In **1990** there were 153 seniors in that years' 25th Anniversary class on Madison and Dewberry Avenues. There were 63 boys (41%) and 90 girls (59%). Dick Culver was the principal. Bob Bukvics taught world cultures, math and foreign policy. Sr. Irma Loreto was a math tutor, nurse's aide and then retired from teaching after 36 years of service to the students at Beca.

Pause and Reflect on teachers' past

As students, we sometimes don't realize the extraordinary life stories of the teachers who have guided and educated us over the years. We learn to really appreciate their contributions as we grow older. As I research the people who have shared part of their lives to help us be the people we are today, I find stories that makes me pause, reflect and grateful for their contribution.

Annette Cecile Hamill

...A lawyer and corporate attorney who served in the Red Cross during WWII, she taught French II and was Moderator of the French Club at Beca from September, 1964 through June, 1967. As was the custom at that time, the Yearbook listed her as "Mrs. James Hamill." Excerpts from article as published in the Morning Call, May 17, 2011

"Annette Cecile Hamill, 99, a resident of The Highlands in Wyomissing, formerly of Emmaus and Venice, FL, went to her Lord and Savior Sunday, May 15th (2011). She was the wife of James A. Hamill, deceased, and they had been married 50 years. Annette was a 1942 graduate of Northeastern University Law School and a member of the Massachusetts Bar. She was the third woman ever to pass both the state and federal bar exams in the state of Massachusetts. She served in the Red Cross in WWII and was a member of the Women's Overseas Service League. She worked as a corporate attorney at Lever Bros. in Boston. She was a member of Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Reading and had been a member of St. Ann Catholic Church in Emmaus. Annette had been a French teacher at both Bethlehem Catholic H.S. and Moravian Prep School in the 1960s. She also served on the Fountain Hill and Bethlehem School Boards. In Venice, she served as secretary of the Epiphany Parish Council and President of the Women's Guild. Born in Methuen, Mass, December 23, 1911, she was the daughter of George A. Maynard and Philomene Victoria Chouinard..."

Joseph Szczepanski

He taught us Spanish. He graduated from Kings College (as had our current principal, Holly DeNofa), and he was born in Nanticoke (whose high school basketball team was defeated by our boys' team in the 1st round of the PIAA State Championship tournament). Excerpts from article as published in the Morning Call, August 2, 2012

"Joseph L "Sarg" Szczepanski, 86, formerly of Bethlehem, died Saturday in the Veterans Administration Nursing Facility, Wilkes-Barre. Born August 20, 1918 in Plymouth Township, he was the son of the late Michael and Anastasia (Luchow) Szczepanski. He graduated from Nanticoke High School in 1937. Upon graduation, he joined the Army. He defended the Philippines, serving under General Wainwright, until surrender in April 1942. He survived the Bataan Death March and spent three years, four months in a mainland Japan POW forced labor camp. Of the 95,000 soldiers captured in Bataan only 5,000 survived the war. Joseph received letters of commendation from General Douglas MacArthur and President Harry S Truman. In 1947 he transferred to the Air Force and served as an aerial photographer in the Strategic Air Command. He retired as a tech sergeant in 1959, after more than 21 years of proud service. After receiving a bachelor's degree from Kings College, he taught (Spanish) at Bethlehem Catholic High School from 1968 to

1976. He was a member of Holy Family Parish, Luzerne. He was a past member of VFWs and American Legions in the Bethlehem and Allentown Area..."
